- allows convicted felons to vote immediately upon release (even if still on parole)
- · mandates increased use of drop boxes
- · creates a permanent absentee voter list
- mandates the Department of Motor Vehicles to automatically register New Mexicans without their consent
- mandates all state agencies or agency contractors to register voters

HB7

- Public school faculty and staff can now facilitate abortion or gender-transitioning services for their students.
- Parental consent or notification is not required under this bill.

HB9

- If a minor accesses a firearm that was stored "negligently" and then brandishes or fires said weapon resulting in injury but not great bodily harm or death, the owner of the weapon will be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- If a minor accesses a firearm that was stored "negligently" and then fires said weapon resulting in great bodily harm or death, the owner of the weapon will be guilty of a fourth-degree felony.

<u>HB31</u>

- A resident who is 14 years old or older may have their name changed by the court without parental consent or notification.
- If the court finds that notice to one or more legal parents of an applicant who is under fourteen years of age will jeopardize the applicant's personal safety, the court shall also not require notice.

HB207

- updates language in the New Mexico Civil Rights Act to include specific LGBTQ language

- includes definitions for the words "sex" and "gender"

<u>HB547</u>

- combines several tax increases proposed in separate bills throughout the session
- significantly decreases the taxpayer rebate promised
- should have never been considered at a time when New Mexico has a \$3.6 billion surplus!
