<u>SB180</u>

- 178-page bill that substantially revises New Mexico's election code
- forces counties to use internet-connected 'poll books' at voting locations
- removes the safeguards around having a minor serve on an election board

FINAL SENATE VOTE: 23-13

13/15 Republicans voted NO.

23/27 Democrats voted YES.

FINAL HOUSE VOTE: 44-25

All 25 Republicans voted NO!

44/45 Democrats voted YES.

<u>SB13</u>

- establishes "reproductive" and "genderaffirming" procedures as "protected health care" exempt from civil or criminal liability by their licensing boards and by other states where such activities are not protected
- prevents parents from seeking any information about protected procedures performed on their children
- creates new rights and exemptions from liability for violating interstate laws for those who perform abortions and transgender procedures

FINAL SENATE VOTE: 26-16

All 15 Republicans voted NO!

26/27 Democrats voted YES.

FINAL HOUSE VOTE: 38-30

24 Republicans voted NO.

38/45 Democrats voted YES.

<u>SB397</u>

- expands "school-based health clinics": 78 clinics currently offer sexual and reproductive health services, including abortion referrals, without parental consent
- expected to include elective transgender
 procedures without parental involvement

FINAL SENATE VOTE: 26-11

11/15 Republicans voted NO.

23/27 Democrats voted YES.

FINAL HOUSE VOTE: 40-25

ALL 25 Republicans voted NO!

40/45 Democrats voted YES.

<u>SB428</u>

- circumvents the PLCAA, a federal law that prohibits gun manufacturers and retailers from being sued over acts of a criminal third party
- singles out the firearms industry and treats violations with respect to firearms much more harshly than other regulated activities through greatly increased penalties and damage limits

FINAL SENATE VOTE: 24-15

14/15 Republicans voted NO.

24/27 Democrats voted YES.

BILL FAILED! NO HOUSE VOTE BEFORE END OF SESSION.

<u>SB64</u>

- requires parole hearings for juvenile criminals after 15, 20, or 25 years depending on the crimes committed
- prevents a juvenile offender from receiving a sentence of life without parole, no matter the crime

FINAL SENATE VOTE: 32-8

8/15 Republicans voted NO.

26/27 Democrats voted YES.

FINAL HOUSE VOTE: 37-25

ALL 25 Republicans voted NO!

37/45 Democrats voted YES.

<u>SB29</u>

- creates medical and geriatric parole
 procedures
- defines "geriatric inmate" as a person who

 (1) is serving a sentence and is confined in a prison or other correctional institution under the control of the corrections department; (2) is fifty-five years of age or older; (3) suffers from a debilitating and chronic infirmity, illness or disease related to aging; and (4) does not constitute a danger to the person's own self or to society at the time of review

FINAL SENATE VOTE: 27-9

9/15 Republicans voted NO.

23/27 Democrats voted YES.

FINAL HOUSE VOTE: 34-25

24/25 Republicans voted NO.

34/45 Democrats voted YES.
