SB397 Analysis

- 2. Compelled Referrals: The bill requires employees of school-based health clinics to refer students for abortion or transgender interventions, regardless of their moral or religious objections. This requirement aligns with the "shall not deny, restrict, or interfere" language in HB7 and the protections in SB13, undermining freedom of speech.
- 3. Risks to Children: Abortion and transgender interventions have potential harms, particularly when minors make permanent life-changing decisions without fully developed brains. School-Based Health Centers remove parental involvement, providing unrestricted access to these interventions, and undermining the well-being of our children.
